Musings from the Manse



This summer at Newton Panbride we have been working our way through Paul's Letter to the Romans. I confessed to the congregation that I had to dust off some old theology books that I had hoped never to see again. However, reading Paul's letters anew made me wonder about the art of letter writing. It really seems to be a lost art.

Most of my correspondence now is done by email or Facebook messenger and even WhatsApp. However, I love to get a card or a letter in the post. There is something special about receiving a handwritten letter or card.

At school I studied Higher French and we were encouraged to have French pen pals. I enjoyed selecting the writing paper and envelopes from the stationery shop Millers on Queen Street in Glasgow. I would mostly write in English but would attempt to include some French in every letter. I wrote about my family, what was happening at school and a little about where I lived in Scotland. And then I went off to the post office to send my letter imagining all the places my letter would travel through before arriving in France. Even more exciting was when I received a letter back. My pen pal would tell me all about her life which always seemed so much more interesting and glamorous than mine.

Later when my best friend moved away from Scotland to live in the far-off West Midlands, we wrote to each other. These were quite different letters. Up until she moved away my friend and I had met up every week since our school days. We shared all of life's key moments. First jobs, 21st birthday parties, wedding days, the birth of our children. We were both young mums at the time and so our letters revolved around our families, but I treasured these letters and kept them for years. With every letter I could hear her laughter and see her smile.

I wonder about the people who received Paul's letters. Did they wait with anticipation? Did they share the same excitement about opening his letters? Did they read them over and over again? Could they sense his love and feel his heartbeat between the written lines? Yes, some of Paul's letters contained rebukes and warnings but he also expressed deep care and affection in his writing.

Some of Paul's letters were written from cramped prison cells while he awaited execution. And yet his words were soaked in the grace and peace of Jesus. Even when he was in chains he wrote to encourage and comfort others.

Unlike Paul's letters, I do not think any of my 'Musings from the Manse' will ever change the world but I do hope they bring comfort and encouragement.

'Peace to the brothers and sisters, and love with faith from God the Father and the Lord Jesus Christ. Grace to all who love our Lord Jesus Christ with an undying love.' (Ephesians 6: 23 – 24)

More Musings from the Manse

Dear friends

Over the Summer we have been trying a 'Why Jesus?' programme to explore faith together at different events – more about the whole programme later in this newsletter. One of our talks and discussions was based around the questions of Science and Faith, covering a huge canvas together.

During that session I reflected on the change in the nature of public understanding of science and religion. Previous generations would have explored problems with evolution and creation, but now matters of faith and doubt are often around science itself. So, we see arguments about whether or not vaccines work, or whether the moon landings were real or fake.

One big question today is on Climate Change. Many are questioning the generally accepted scientific conclusions that man-made Climate Change is really happening. The argument over science is no longer about the challenge to Christian faith, but over what people of any faith or none believe about science itself.

For myself, I have long been convinced of the evidence that man-made Climate Change is real. We have long known about the 'greenhouse effect' of CO₂ and other gases helping to keep our planet at a comfortable temperature by preventing some of the energy from the sun escaping the atmosphere.

We also know that the concentration of CO₂ in the atmosphere has gone up by over 50% in just the last 150 years – a faster rise than has ever been measured over the last 800,000 years. And the evidence from global and satellite measurements is clear that the atmosphere and the seas are all warming faster than normal variations.

In many ways, all of this is about faith. Not necessarily Christian faith, but whether or not we trust and believe in the evidence presented by the vast majority of scientists today. And for Christians, if we do accept these findings, we then must ask what we should do about it.

For we believe that all creation belongs to God, and He has entrusted us with its care – human beings are therefore called not to use it all up and let it all go to waste, but to nurture, repair and heal the wounds of this planet. Nor can we allow ourselves to sink into despair, for we also trust in a God who is able to do more than we can ask or imagine.

Whether or not you are convinced about the level of danger from man-made Climate Change, our task is always to care for this world and to make a difference. We labour together for the good of what God has made, looking to the long term and not just for today. This is God's world, and we are His stewards.

We meet on the second and fourth Sunday of the month in the Panbride Hall from 11.00am to 12 noon.

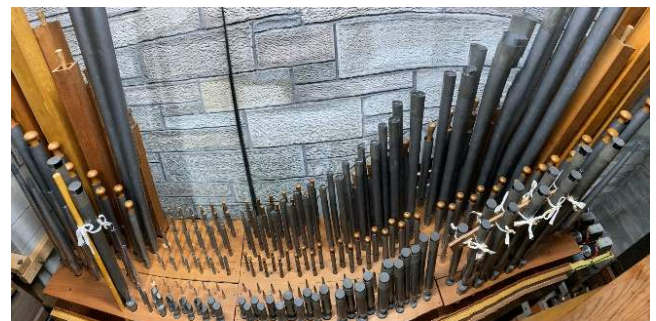

Pipework before restoration



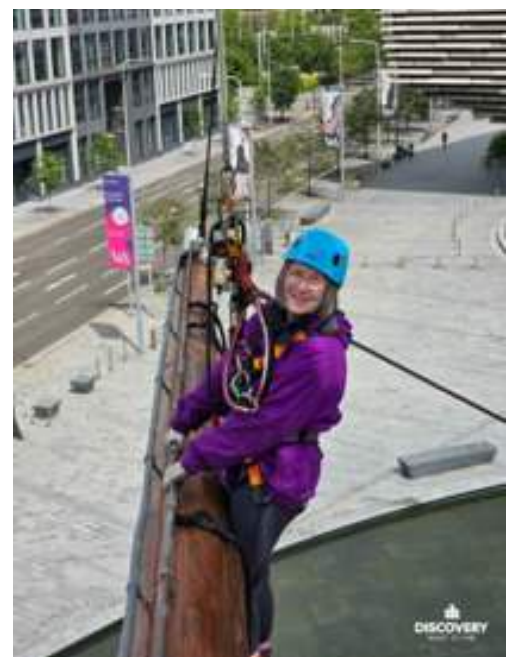

Why Jesus?

This summer we launched our outreach project 'Why Jesus?' to explore the very basics of our faith in Christ Jesus. This excitement can be best shown in two conversations I had during the summer: one with a regular churchgoer and the other with an agnostic. The churchgoer said, "I have been going to church all my life, but it is just so nice being able to think about these things for the first time." It serves as a reminder that although we may attend Sunday worship, our faith is not static. It is constantly adapting and growing, so we have to do something with it.

In another conversation with an agnostic, I was asked: "Are you going to keep hosting similar events after the summer? I don't want to commit to Sunday worship, but I have really enjoyed myself." It is therefore vital that, though we may give thanks to God for the work that he has done within our church across the summer, we do not stop here because local mission of this sort is part of our calling as God's people.

So ask yourself, what can we be doing to make our church more approachable for our community?

Medicine Blister Packs

Since May, another two bags of empty medicine blister packs have been sent off for recycling. It is important to remember that only the empty blister packs can be included in the bag. Please do not fasten packs together in separate bags or use elastic bands, it just makes it time consuming to have to go through every donation to make sure there are only empty medicine blister packs.

Once the packs are accepted for recycling, they are broken up and made into pellets that can be used to make different items.

Building and Construction: Extruded plastic profiles used for window frames, structural building panels, and heavy-duty industrial or domestic piping.

Composite Sheets: Pressed boards utilized for furniture construction, interior storage partitions, and retail displays.

Outdoor and Infrastructure Materials: Recycled plastic lumber, garden edging, fencing, and playground equipment components.

Metal Components: Smelted aluminium recovered from the foil backing, repurposed into secondary metal elements, industrial nuts, bolts, or steel-making components.

So, as you can see it is worthwhile to collect and hand in your empty blister packs to be used in a positive way.

I will have to purchase more bags after the next lot have been sent away so any cash donations will be welcome to help with that purchase.

As long as the interest and support keep coming, I am happy to continue sending off the bags so please hand in your empty blister packs knowing they are going to be recycled.
